There is no institution either in Tamil Nadu or anywhere else, which is fully devoted to research, documentation and preservation of objects and documents related to the classical phase of Tamil.

MAJOR PROJECTS

The ongoing activities of the Institute will include the following ten major projects:

1

Definitive editions of Ancient Tamil Works is to bring out a definitive edition of each of the forty-one Tamil Classics with accuracy and authenticity.

2

Historical Grammar of Tamil is to bring out a comprehensive treatise on the historical grammar of Tamil which evolved from Classical Age (B.C. 300 to A.D. 600) to Modern Age (A.D. 1601 till date) through Middle Age (A.D. 601 to A.D. 1600)

3

Translation of Ancient Tamil works is to evaluate and edit the extant English translations available for all the forty-one Tamil classics. A fresh translation of these classics into other Dravidian and non-Dravidian family of languages in India and English and other world languages will be initiated on priority basis.

4

Antiquity of Tamil is to initiate interdisciplinary researches on various areas of studies that reflect the nature of society, culture and language of ancient Tamils.

5

Synchronic and Diachronic study of Tamil Dialects is to prepare demography of the Tamil speaking population around the world; to prepare a comprehensive dictionary of Tamil dialects, and to prepare a comprehensive linguistic Atlas of Tamil dialects.

6

Tamil, Dravidian Languages and other Family of languages takes up comparative studies on Tamil with other Dravidian and non-Dravidian family of languages in India and also Tamil with other language families such as Indo-Aryan, Astro-Asiatic, Tibeto-Burman, Andamanese, Finno-Ugric, African and Australian.

7

Digital Library for Ancient Tamil Studies is to create an online repository for Tamil classics and reference materials for antiquity studies.

8

Classical Tamil online provides a web based course in Classical Tamil for the learners interested in interpreting the language as found in the ancient Tamil literary texts.

9

Corpus Development for Classical Tamil Works is to prepare a machine readable corpus on Tamil classics with thematic and grammatical tagging.

10

Visual Episodes on Classical Tamil is to popularise the antiquity and uniqueness of the ancient Tamil society through visual episodes produced on various social and historical occurrences described in the Tamil Classics.

AWARDS

Central Institute of Classical Tamil has both Presidential Awards for Classical Tamil and Kalaignar M. Karunanidhi Classical Tamil Award.

Presidential Awards for Classical Tamil consist of the following:

Tolkappiyar Award (cash of Rupees five lakh for each year for Indian nationals) is given to eminent senior scholars with an outstanding contribution in the field of Tamil studies.

Kural Peedam Award (cash of Rupees five lakh for each year for one Indian and one foreign national) is given to distinguished scholars with an outstanding contribution in the field of Tamil studies.

Young Scholar Award (a certificate of honour, a memento and cash of Rupees 1 lakh for five scholars each year) is given to young scholars (in the age group of 30-40 years) who have shown interest and excellence in Tamil studies with publications.



KALAINAR M. KARUNANIDHI CLASSICAL TAMIL AWARD

Kalaignar M. Karunanidhi, former Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu and Chairman, CICT, has created out of his personal funds an endowment in his name for Classical Tamil Research in the CICT. From the endowment, an award, one of the highest honours conferred in India, is given to a scholar or researcher of eminence every year.



The award carries:

- A cheque for Rupees ten lakh
- An eighty gram gold medal bearing the image of the Donor
- A five-metal statue of Tiruvalluvar




LIBRARY


BUDGET

During the financial year 2010-11, CICT, Chennai received a grant of Rs.1088.95 lakh from Ministry of Human Resource Development out of which Rs.1016.31 lakh was utilized for various approved programmes in furtherance of objectives enshrined in the Memorandum of Association. Ministry of Human Resource Development approved to carry forward the unspent amount of Rs.72.64 lakh to the next financial year 2011-12.

CONSTRUCTION OF BUILDING FOR CICT

Land measuring 16.586 acres (6.71.5 hectare) in Perumbakkam, Chennai was offered free of cost to this Institute by the Government of Tamil Nadu in May 2008. As the land was in low lying area, earth filling for levelling the ground has been completed by the State P.W.D. The work of construction of Compound Wall at a cost of Rs.247.88 lakh has been entrusted to the Central P.W.D. Construction of compound wall on three sides has been completed and in the front side other than the portion near main entrance, the rest of the construction has been completed

The accounts for the year 2009-10 along with Report for 2009-10 were sent to Ministry of Human Resource Development during February 2011. The Report for the year 2009-10 was placed on the tables for both houses of Parliament in March 2011.

The accounts for the year 2010 - 11 have been finalized and audited by O/o Principal Accountant General (CA), Tamil Nadu and Puducherry, Chennai. However, separate Audit Report (SAR) was not issued since the accounts are yet to be approved by the Governing Board/ Competent Authority. Considering the delay in approval of accounts by Governing Board, the accounts have been the submitted to Hon'ble Ministry of State for Ministry of Human Resource Development and Hon'ble Chairperson of Finance Committee of CICT Dr. Purundeswari for approval.

Significant Accounting polices

The following are the significant Accounting polices

1. Till the accounting year 2008-09, accounts of CICT, Chennai were maintained on "Cash Accounting basis". From the year 2009-10 onwards the accounts are maintained on "Accrual basis of Accounting" (i.e. Mercantile System of Accounting).

2. The value of stocks is arrived at and valued after deducting the depreciation at prescribed rates. The value of stocks as at the end of 31st March 2011 indicated in the schedule 3 to Income and Expenditure Account is the book value of the fixed assets.

3. The Depreciation on fixed assets is charged as per "Straight Line Method" of accounting Depreciation. This system is consistently followed.

4. The Depreciation on Fixed Assets is charged at the following rates per annum as per the Income Tax Rules.

i.	Computers	=	60%
ii.	UPS	=	60%
iii.	Printers	=	15%
iv.	Books (including visual Episode)	=	20%
v.	Furniture	=	10%
vi.	Office Equipments	=	15%

5. Depreciation on Fixed assets purchased within six months of the latter half of the accounting year is charged at 50% of the prescribed rates.

We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. Based on our audit, we report that:

- I. We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
- II. In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by Central Institute of Classical Tamil, Chennai as required in the rules and regulations of the Institute in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- III. We further report that:
 - A. Out of the payment of Rs.1.20 crore made towards short term projects, statements of expenditure in respect of short term projects for Rs.82.095 lakh released to 32 Principal Investigators were not obtained. Hence, the utilization of entire grant for the specific projects could not be ensured in audit.
 - B. Grants-in-aid
Out of the Grants-in-aid of Rs.10.89 crore received during 2010-11, the Institute could utilize only Rs.10.16 crore leaving Rs.0.73 crore as unutilized grant as on 31st March 2011.
- IV. Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- V. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters

mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India.

A. In so far as relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of Central Institute of Classical Tamil, Chennai as at 31 March 2011; and

B. In so far as it relates to Income & Expenditure Account, of the surplus for the year ended on that date.
